After the model of Danez Smith, write a poem that gives 12 alternate names for YOU. Write about yourself in the third person: How do you describe your identity? How do people define you?

Write a poem that illustrates how you think you are perceived. Whose opinions are you most concerned with? What do these perceptions affect? How? Why?
